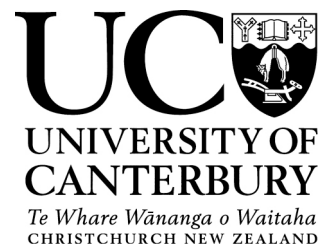

INFORMATION

If you are one of twenty-five students to be accepted to take part in The Pettman Junior Academy of Music you will receive a \$4,000 scholarship. You will have been chosen because of your musical ability and potential to pursue music in the future. The aim of the Junior Academy is to guide and nurture your musical gift and to provide you with opportunities that will extend and develop your talent and musical knowledge.

It is important, as a Junior Academy member, that you fulfil every opportunity offered with interest and dedication. Your attitude is just as important as your musical talent.

Acceptance is based on artistic and technical merit, as well as the number of available places.

Every Junior Academy member must take part in the full programme provided, and the programme shall be a top priority for each student. This programme takes part during the University of Canterbury academic year.

The Junior Academy will provide:

- two lessons per week (each lesson is 45 minutes) with a Junior Academy teacher of their instrument;
- chamber music lessons with an assigned group and teacher;
- lectures and masterclasses throughout the year;
- performance opportunities throughout the year and Junior Academy concerts at the Great Hall of The Arts Centre.

Every student must:

- support and attend every Junior Academy lesson, masterclass, and concert at The Great Hall, whether or not they are performing;
- co-operate and respect all Junior Academy and University of Canterbury staff;
- show a deep and positive interest and enthusiasm in all activities and events provided by the Junior Academy.

Students accepted into the Academy will have demonstrated their ability at an early age, along with the capability to work with focus and purpose. At the Academy, young musicians will enjoy an atmosphere where their artistic gift and technical skills will grow and flourish.
